

IMO TRAINING RIDE

April 26, 2008

<u>1</u> IRA	112°	From the U.S. Coastal & Geodetic Survey Benchmark South of Headquarters.
	182°	From a man-made pile of rocks in the draw SE of HQs with an owl watching over it.
<u>2</u>	235°	From the Blue Butterfly NE of the road sitting on a stump in the creek bed.
	170°	From a small rectangular piece of old, weathered plywood lying by the west gate post in the fence at the end of the road.
<u>3</u>	100°	From a flagged white step-in fiberglass post near where the drainage forks.
	342°	From a flagged black step-in fiberglass post in a draw.
<u>4</u>	192°	From the SW corner post of the irrigated field.
	248°	From a “bloomin” sage bush (red, white and blue “blooms”).
<u>5</u>	30°	From the “Flagged” bush in the bottom of the south branch of the drainage.
	192°	From a flagged man-made pile of rocks in the north branch of the drainage.

NOTES:

This is a training ride; it is not timed and everyone who participates in any manner will earn 10 points.

The gophers, ground squirrels, rabbits, and badgers are very active in this area. LOTS OF HOLES. Please ride carefully.

The roads and trails show on the map do exist. There are roads and motorcycle trails that are not shown on the map. There aren't any gates to open.

Flagging (without quote marks) is bright orange. “Flagged” (in quotes) is a different kind of flag.

REMEMBER: Don't travel west if you should be going east. North is deceptive out here, so check your direction of travel frequently.

Please pick up and/or scatter manure before leaving camp, and fill in all steed-made holes. Thank You.
