APRIL 26, 2008, Murphy, Idaho

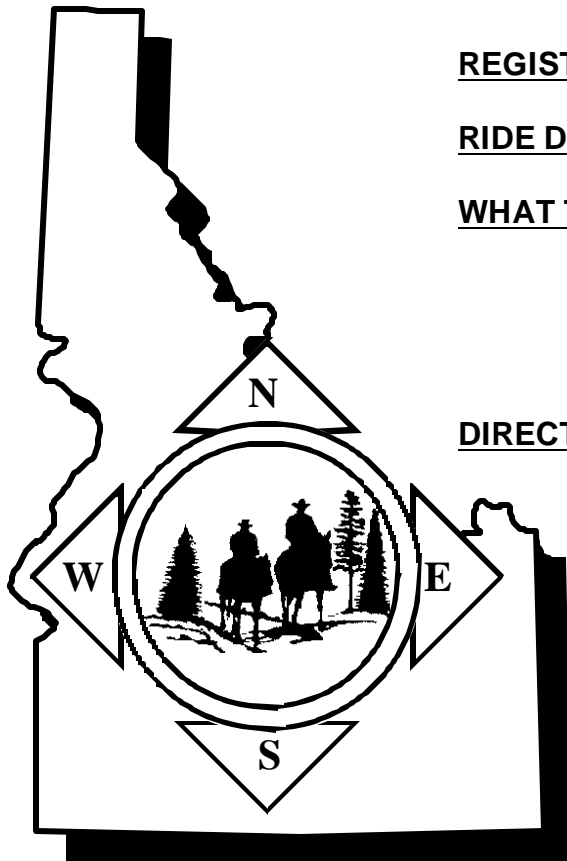
Looking for a new way to have fun in the great outdoors with your equine partner? IMO!

**REGISTRATION:** SATURDAY 9:00 A.M.—12:00 P.M. Riders out starting at 9:30 a.m.

**RIDE DUES:** \$5 per Rider

**WHAT TO BRING:** A can of chili per person for after-ride lunch  
A chair for your comfort while eating and visiting  
A compass with 2° increments, and a pen or pencil  
A trusty steed at least 3 years old  
Water for your steed and a beverage for yourself

**DIRECTIONS:** From I84, take Exit 38 (Garrity/ID Center); turn south on Garrity; turn left on 16th Av N; turn right on 7th St S; turn left on 12th Av S (Hwy 45); about 14 miles south of Nampa, after crossing the Snake River, go south (to left) on Hwy 78 about 10 miles to Murphy. Just before entering Murphy (at the 45 MPH sign), turn left on Con Shea Basin Rd; 1.5 mile to camp.
