Participants timed out in 15-minute Intervals starting at 7:30 a.m.

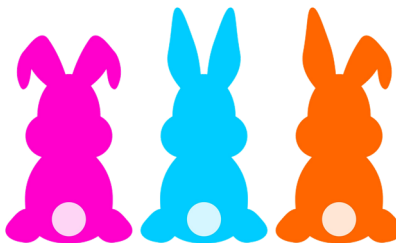
Starting times chosen at registration. All participants must find number 1 before timing out.

DIRECTIONS: From I84, Exit 57, Gowen Rd./Hwy 21, in E Boise, **TURN E** on Hwy 21. Travel E, SE, then N on Hwy 21 to Idaho City (about 34 miles from the stoplight at Hwy 21 & Federal Way). Stay on Hwy 21 through Idaho City, travelling about 2.2 miles past Main St., to Granite Creek Rd. (**Forest Service Road 327**). **TURN E** (right) on Rd. 327 (starts off as Granite Creek Rd., becomes Rabbit Creek Rd. Travel on Rd. 327 about 10 miles to camp at the junction of Rd. 327 and Rd. 322. This last 10 miles can take up to an hour, depending on road conditions. There is quite a bit of good parking on both sides of 327 and 322, if we get to it before the OHV users.
