GRIMES CREEK RIDE

September 19, 2009, Pioneerville, Idaho

A timed, competitive equine event using map & compass to find 5 hidden markers.

Pioneerville was the first mining camp of any importance in the historic Boise Basin mining area. Founded in 1862 by two survivors of a prospecting party led by George Grimes, it was a “here today, gone tomorrow” town. Hostile Indians were one problem; but the main problem to its survival, the ores quickly ran out. Remnants of mining and dredging are visible throughout the area.

Ride the 16 mile competitive course, or the 8 mile short course, along scenic forest roads and trails. Water for steeds is available on the trail and camp is right on Grimes Creek. Some parts are rocky.

NECESSITIES

Steed (3+ yrs old); Compass; Certified noxious-weed-free hay or cubes; Bug spray; Pen or Pencil; Chair if you want to sit; Rake & Shovel
(Camp is on private property—steeds must be “stabled” at least 75 feet from the creek and hay and manure must be removed before leaving.)

Ride Managers will provide the main course.

Please bring potluck-something to share, and your own beverages.

DIRECTIONS

Take Hwy 21 to Idaho City. Turn left on Montgomery St., go N to Centerville Rd.
Turn left on Centerville Rd., go W about 7 miles to Grimes Pass Rd.
Turn right on Grimes Pass Rd., go N about 6 miles. Turn right into camp
(just after crossing Grimes Ck. on a big culvert)
